

# CILAC 2018 Open Forum

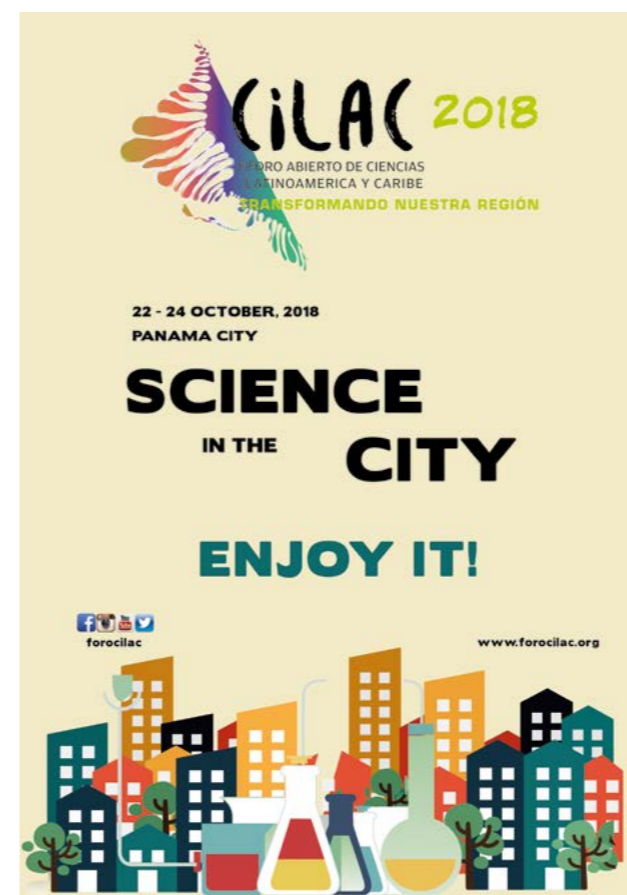
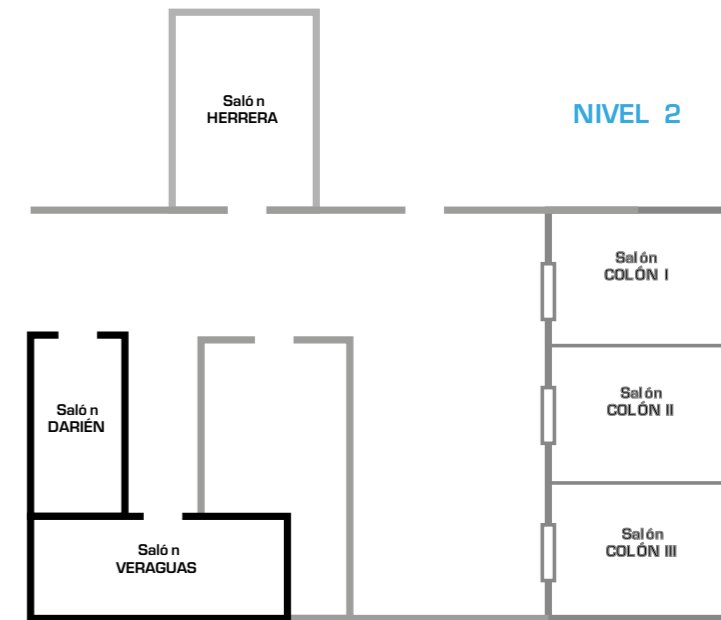
